

Mount-up in the Mountains Competitive Trail Ride

June 7 - 9, 2019
Information Sheet

The ride will be held in beautiful Kananaskis country. As this site is in an Alberta Park certain rules must be applied at all times (see below for more information)

This is a 1 day ride with novice, intermediate and Open divisions. Friday registration will begin at 3 pm with initial vet in beginning at 4 pm. Please arrive on the Friday for the ride on Saturday. Please send in your entry forms by May 24th so that we can have an estimate for food.

Hoof Protection is strongly recommended!

All participants must be AEF members prior to the ride for insurance purposes. Please have this done before you arrive and bring proof of membership with you. It is the riders' responsibility to be familiar with the rules. The TRAC handbook can be found at <http://www.trailriding.ca/resources/trac-handbook.html>

All juniors are required to wear a helmet at all times when mounted, even in camp when not competing. It is not mandatory for adults to wear a helmet but it is highly recommended and a good example to the juniors.

Volunteers are always needed. If you can help out please contact Kyleigh Semmens. Lunch and supper will be provided for riders and volunteers on Saturday. Extra meal tickets will be available at the ride office. Breakfast will be provided Sunday Morning. Please bring your own mugs, plates and utensils.

You are responsible for your own garbage – please take it home.

Directions to the campsite: Camping will be set up on the right hand side of Highway 549 just before North Fork Provincial Recreational Area. From highway 22 take the exit to highway 549 west. Follow the highway past highway 762 to the camping area. Signs will mark the way. (Maps below are a guide)

Please remove all garbage and waste

Please ensure all garbage remaining on site overnight is placed in secured bear-resistant containers (placing in your vehicle or trailer is acceptable).

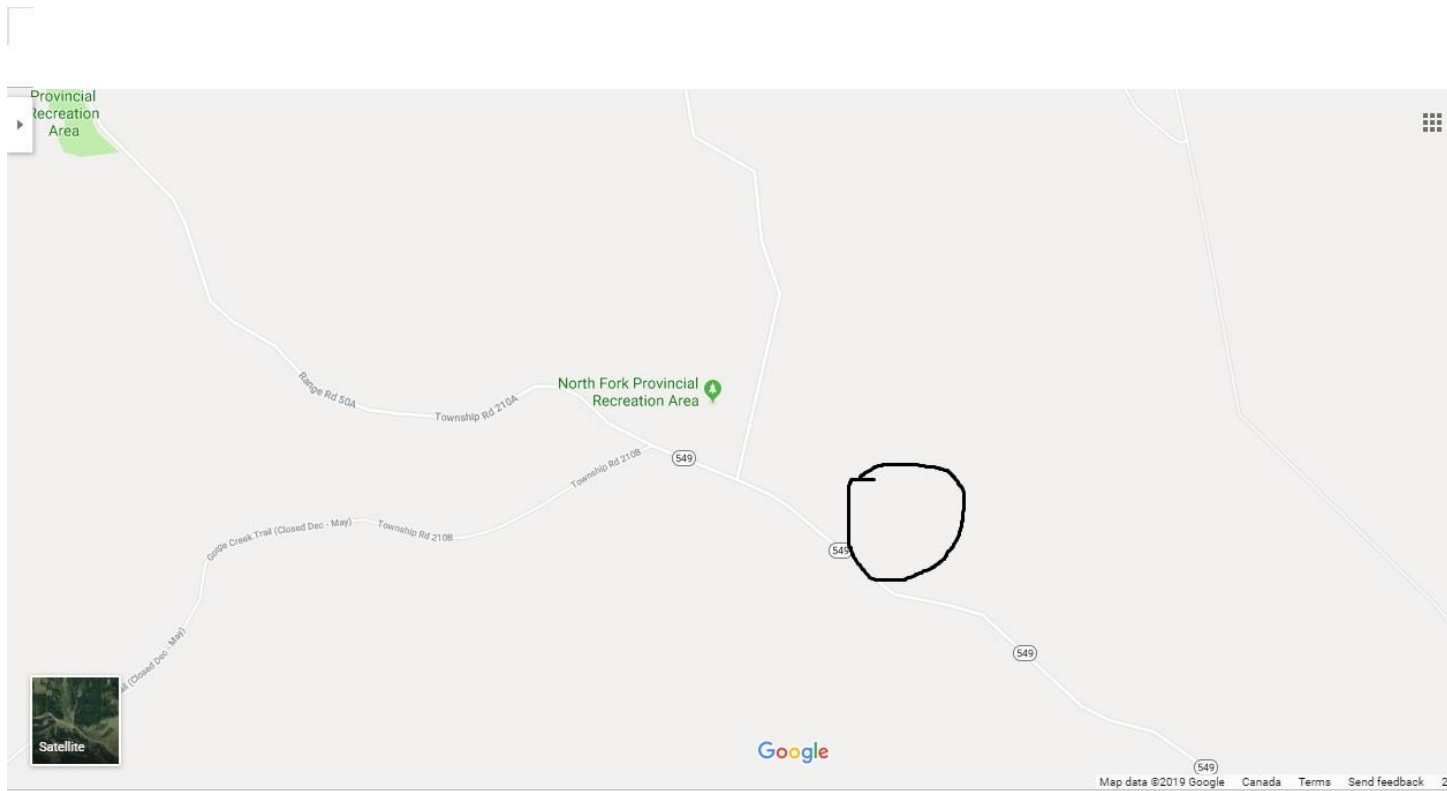
Only weed-free hay is permitted on site. Weed free hay must be certified in advance and all certificates sent to Kyleigh Semmens before May 24 2019. Certificates must also be present on site for the weekend. Hay cubes, and processed feed can be used as an alternative. IN fact soaked hay cubes are a great extra source of water!

Please take home all manure.

We thank you for your corporation on all the above items, if all goes well more rides at this site will hopefully be in our future!
